





Throughout November & December, we have been competing in the Regional Badminton events, which have taken place at Inspire Suffolk,

Pitting ourselves against a number of local schools, our **U16 Girls** (*made up of Y10 students*) finished impressively in 3rd position, missing out on the semifinals due to set difference.

Meanwhile, the **U14 Boys** side placed in a respectable 5th position from 8 schools, obtaining equal wins and losses across the afternoon, whilst facing some experienced County players along the way.

Finally, the U14 Girls (*Didi*; *Lakshna*; *Christy*; *Joshitha*) just missed out on a semifinal place after finishing 3rd in their group. Despite winning numerous games, they narrowly missed out in their final match after losing 15-14 in one of their singles matches,, which resulted in an overall 2-1 loss. 
