Why study Modern Foreign Languages at St alban's catholic high school?











1. Improved Job Prospects

- Forms part of the English Baccalaureate
- Looks good on your CV
- UK workforce suffers from chronic shortage of people at all levels with usable language skills
- Companies need personnel with technical or professional skills plus another language
- 8% additional salary
- languages can be used in any job as soon as there is a need for any form of communication in a second language

Latest research

- •75% of employers want language skills
- •`conversational ability that builds rapport'

•Main demand is still for European

- languages:
 - -50% want French,
 - -49% German
 - -41% Spanish.



•Interest also in Mandarin/Cantonese.

All these companies have advertised posts with languages recently



2. Further Study and Beyond

• Languages combine well with virtually any subject

Degrees such as English with French to Law with German

• one in seven people at university studies a language as part of their degree

• learn now rather than later!

2. Further Study and Beyond

• Unemployment in recent years amongst people with degrees: All new UK graduates: 5.5% Modern Languages Graduates: 4.3%

• Business services, banking and finance, wholesale and retail, manufacturing and public administration, etc, etc!

3. It's a Myth that "Everyone speaks English anyway"!!

- 75% of the world's population does not speak English
- 60% of British trade is with non-English speaking countries
- Buy in the native language, sell in the customer's
- British Business has the poorest language skills in Europe
