What a cracking summer! The weather made for a wonderful start, and topped off for us with excellent examination results – a significant improvement on last year – with increases in the top grades awarded at A level and huge gains in strong passes and A's and A* (8's and 9's in new money!). Thank you for all your support at home. I am so pleased to see so many stay on with us in to Year 12, and we wish the Year 13 students every blessing as they start higher education or employment.

This year brings several notable changes to our academic and pastoral structures, designed to increase performance and support for our students. Each student in main school has a Head of Year who has extra time to intervene with underachievement and support well-being. The Sixth Form now has a Deputy Head - Mrs Robinson. Each department is now grouped into a faculty; the idea being that common practices of excellence can be shared. One example of this is the CPA Faculty (Creative and Performing Arts). Mrs Wright now leads this team, and is charged with ensuring standards across Art, PE, Music and Drama.

I have added our School Improvement Plan to the website so that you know our aspirations for the year ahead, and governors will hold us to account for our progress against this. A big change in parental engagement next month will be our parent app, which will allow you see live achievement and behavior updates, along with our new parental online booking for Consultation Evenings. Parents and students having their say and being able to support improvement is vital to a healthy and reflective school!

On a sadder note, as those from St Mary's Parish will know, we are losing Fr John Warrington both from our school and as a governor. Following a period of illness, Fr John is recovering in Bury St Edmunds and has left Ipswich. Over the last couple of years that I have known John, he has been such a supportive priest to this school, celebrating engaging and personal Masses, as well as offering many Sacramental and other spiritual services to us. My strong bond with him will certainly endure. Students and staff, past and present, will join together to give thanks for his ministry with us next Wednesday. Katherine Edwards, our Chaplain, will write to you to support a collection for him. Please give if you can.

Could I also ask at this time for us to pray for our families with roots in Kerala, following the flooding in August.

Attendance – Information for Parents

Attendance at St Alban's is high. We are proud of this and we work hard to maintain it. This is because generally the students who achieve their GCSE potential are those who have been rarely absent.

Low attendance is a major cause for concern that will result in intervention with parents or carers. Typical attendance here is over 96% and if your child's attendance is heading towards 90% then you can expect us to be in touch to make a plan to improve this.

Regular attendance here means attending every day, unless an absence is pre-agreed with the school. This means that term-time holidays, trips abroad to visit family, extended school holidays, etc. will not be authorised by the school. Unauthorised absences will result in fines being issued.

Please call us if your child has an urgent appointment and will be late for school or needs to leave during the day. Your child will not be permitted to sign out during the school day without the necessary consent. Non-urgent appointments should be made outside of school times or in the holidays.

Also, do inform us of changes to your details such as your address, who has parental responsibility, your phone numbers, etc.

Be wary of your child reporting minor illnesses (headache, stomach upset, etc.) on a Monday. We have up to three times as many absences on Mondays as the other days.

We expect students to be through the school gates by 8.45am.

Cyber Discover

This school year, I participated in **Cyber Discovery**, a 4 stage program. If you completed enough of the first stage 14 security challenges you qualified for the next two stages. These were Game and Essentials. Game involving security challenges and a set of written and video lessons that explained the theory behind computer security. Each module in Essentials ended with an exam. The scores achieved in Game and Essentials went towards deciding whether you qualified for the final stage, Elite. Elite was a weekend long camp, where we listened to lectures from industry experts and participated in team based activities such as a CTF event and hacking into a server on site.

Overall I've learnt a lot over the program and found it really challenging. I'd highly recommend it to anyone with any interest in problem solving or computers. Very little, if any prior knowledge is required. It's all about your skills in analytics, logical thinking and trying stuff till it works.

- * Extreme hairstyles, including brightly coloured hair

- * Earrings that are not a simple gold or silver stud
- * Any jewellery that is not a cross
- Trainers, unless for PE
- * Shoes with logos on

We were able to deliver hampers to families through organisations such as Social Services, the Iceni project, MIND, Headway and EACH children's hospice. One family couldn't thank us enough for their Christmas hamper.

We received a card from someone who received a Christmas Hamper last year. The organisation that delivered the hamper commented on how beautiful the hamper looked and said that the family's faces lit up when it was received.

The family are refugees that have recently been housed in the town and been really worried about how they would source and fund a Christmas dinner for their three children. They were overwhelmed with the luxury products and even commented on the beautiful purple bow that was tied around their hamper. Their 6 year old daughter was delighted with the ribbon and played with it all of Christmas day to tie around her doll.

This is just one story in a 105 Christmas hampers that were delivered around our town in 2017.

This year we are aiming for 150 Christmas hampers, as the need in Ipswich is so great. Each hamper has a number of items which make up a Christmas dinner alongside a £10 meat voucher which can be redeemed at a local supermarket. Each form will be collecting items for their hampers, but we always welcome contributions from families, work places etc. All items can be delivered to the school office and packs are available for both businesses and education institutions to get them involved in the campaign.
