There have been so many good news stories already this term. Schools have received their national GCSE data scores from the Department for Education, and I am proud of the students and staff in their achievements. Our progress measure (P8) was even higher than forecast, a significant increase on last year. Not only was progress good, but our attainment was high, signalling a shift upwards in all grades.

Autumn term is also the window for school admissions. I have visited many of our local primary schools, and enjoyed sharing our new successes. Along with a positive Open Evening and Open Morning, I am looking at a vibrant future for the school. Increasing Sixth Form numbers supports this view!

In times of financial challenge in school, I am pleased to announce successful bids for extra money to support our young people. Mrs Lawrence, Assistant Headteacher, and Mrs Sandvig, Executive Headteacher in our proposed MAT, have won a joint bid of £25,000 to improve the teaching of Mathematics across Key Stage 2 and 3. In addition, we have secured a bid for an extra £50,000 over two years for staff development. This is an incredible opportunity to upskill all staff and make sure they have the latest and best training.

As some of you may have read in the EADT, Stowmarket High School teacher Charlotte Shields-Bayliss died last week at the age of 29, only recently having given birth to her daughter. Year 13 A Level Biology - Residential Field Trip September 2018

Six intrepid Biology students spent three days and two nights at Flatford Mill Field Studies Centre. The course was led by a member of the team at Flatford and the students were accompanied by Mrs Roberts.

The field trip is an integral component of the A Level Biology course. Apart from being an internationally renowned site of historical and artistic significance, Flatford is ideal for completing part of the Core Practical assessment required by the examination boards; there are a wide variety of habitats at the site or close by.



The students worked hard; the days started with breakfast at 8.00am, an early start for some, then into the classroom. There were short breaks for lunch and tea (with cake) during the working day, however they were back in the classroom after dinner until 8.30pm. Some of the practical work included carrying out a survey of Holbrook saltmarsh on the River Stour; this involved sampling plant life along a transect from the water's edge to the shore. They also dipped ponds and lakes, measured biodiversity in woodlands and considered the correlation between non-living factors such as light and water availability with the diversity and abundance of species. On the third day the students had to plan and carry out an investigation independently.

The students all agreed that they had achieved a great deal but they were ready for a weekend to recover from the hard work!

Mobile Phones and Headphones

Mobile phones are, for many of our students, a vital communication tool to ensure that they get to and from school safely. The ability to communicate with you as parents and carers is important and we recognise this. The rules for the use of these devices are that they should **be put away and switched off when they arrive at the school grounds**. If a student needs to get in contact with home there are mechanisms in place, either through the school office or Pastoral support staff.

There are times where mobile phones may be used for educational purposes in lessons, and in this event, it is at the discretion of the class teacher if they feel that this will enhance learning. At 3.15pm mobile phones are permitted to be used again as this may help with arranging pick-ups and lifts. Headphones can also become a distraction and now seem to be something of a fashion item, which can be very expensive. Again, once on the school grounds these are not permitted for use and should be kept away in students bags.

ClassCharts - Parent and Student App

Shortly after the half-term break we will be rolling out access to the ClassChart app. There is one specifically for parents/carers, and one for students. ClassCharts enables staff to track and monitor student behaviour, and soon you will be able to do this too. The app can be downloaded for free directly from the app store for both Google and iOS devices. Every parent/carer and student will be emailed an individualised code, which will allow you to access your child's/student account.

I hope that this new innovation will further help with our engagement with you, so you can see the many positive, and sometimes negative interactions that go on at school.

PYF - County Lines Play

On Thursday 11th October Year 8 and 9 students took part in a day to educate and raise awareness around the issues of gang culture and county lines, which is affecting all parts of the UK. This safeguarding work is a vital part of our ongoing programme to help prepare our students for the wider world. We want our students to achieve, but more importantly know the risks that the wider world can present, and therefore know how to avoid these. Year 8 covered specific work on dangers of grooming and how this process works, whilst Year 9 watched a film on gang culture and its effect on a school environment. Both Year groups then watched a hard hitting and though provoking play called 'County Lines: Out in the Counties' from Alterego Creative Solutions. The play lasted for 40 minutes, and was then followed by a 20 minute question and answer session.

The students were absolutely brilliant in engaging with the actors and asked some very challenging questions. We even managed to get a feature on BBC Look East, which is a fantastic way of highlighting this concerning issue to the wider public. The four students interviewed (Sam, Christian, Rebecca-May and Monique) were all praised by reporter Kevin Birch for how articulate and confident they were speaking to camera.



Students competed against other schools to complete challenges involving different kinds of sensor and motors. One of the main tasks was following a line. Students experimented to see which algorithm produced the fastest time around the track.

All students enjoyed the experience and some were inspired to look at choosing robotics as a project to go toward their course at the end of Year 13.
