Again we thank you for your support and will update you regarding the journey of our hampers.







Do you have unanswered questions? Have you ever thought about being a laser gun operator? Or are you just interested in what jobs involve science and what science is all about. Whatever your interests are, I'm A Scientist Get Me Out Of Here is the thing for you!

On 05/11/2018 year 9 had the fantastic opportunity to talk to 6 leading scientists via a live chat room. They were aiven the opportunity to ask them questions they wanted ranging from "when does the sky become space" and "what exactly is the field of 6 astrophysics". The scientists answered their questions as best as they could. After, Year 9 had a vote on which scientist they wanted to win.
